The Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) is the nation's largest federal child assistance program.

Through CCDBG, states and counties help families access safe, reliable, affordable child care that allows parents to work, and promotes children's healthy growth and development.

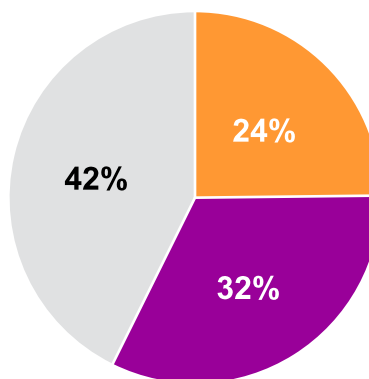
While CCDBG plans are developed and implemented at the state level, some states systems are locally administered systems.

In these states, counties play a major role in administering CCDBG funds, as well as coordinating with the state agency on current early childhood programs active in a county.

CCDBG highlights the two-generation approach to service delivery through its support of parents' work and the promotion of children's healthy development. In addition to financial assistance for child care, CCDBG provides parents with access to reliable child care, which supports employment efforts.
